In their last meeting, they decided they wanted to focus on making our school healthier so have made their own healthy snack policy for breaktimes, after consulting with all classes. #### Eden Class

In Eden we have explored numbers up to 9 and 10. The children have used their super subitising skills to see the amounts and not count. They have begun learning number bonds to 5 and 10 and can demonstrate this using objects, pictures and numbers. In art we have learnt about the artist Andy Goldsworthy and had fun making our own nature art in the forest using pinecones, shells, sticks and stones. We talked about the transient nature of our art and how it wasn't harmful to the environment. At home you could make your own transient art using loose parts or natural items when out on a walk.

## Clyde Class

In Clyde class we have been working hard on our multiplications in particular our 2s and 10s. In English we have been writing letters to our friends to persuade them to visit the Isle of Struay linked to Katie Morag. In Science we have been exploring and trying to identify which plants would grow from seeds and bulbs. We have also been busy practising our dance for the dance festival. Last week we had lots of fun at the skipping festival with our friends from Henshaw. We have started to explore the religion Islam and learn about their beliefs. Please continue to support your child's learning at home by listening to them read and practise their spellings.

#### Danube Class

In Danube class this week the children have been continuing to learn about mass and capacity. They have been adding grams, kilograms and identifying equivalent capacities and volumes. During our English lessons we have been researching the Ancient Egyptians, with the use of technology and have been drafting our non-chronological reports. The children have enjoyed learning about the life of the Ancient Egyptians and will continue to explore them in greater depth in history. Please continue to support your child at home with their spellings, reading and times tables. We also hope that you can continue to encourage the children to use Sumdog at home.

# Mississippi Class

Mississippi class continue to focus on reading and times tables. In English, we have been writing a non-chronological report, linked to our Frozen Kingdoms topic in Geography. The children have written some wonderful reports, celebrating all that we have learnt and researched during the topic. In maths, we having been exploring shapes, calculating perimeter and area and looking at some algebra. In science, we continue our topic on the human and animal life cycles, exploring each stage of the life cycle and the human circulatory system. We started the term with a trip to Hexham Library to learn about the human impact on the environment, told in a creative way through story telling and puppetry. We also had an engaging experience at the Life museum in Newcastle, exploring different aspects of science and the solar system. Continue to support your children through reading, Sumdog, Spelling Shed, times tables and dance rehearsals!
