English

Our writing styles for this half-term will be:

- Non-chronological reports
- Stories from other cultures
- Poetry

R.E.

Our thematic learning in R.E. this half-term poses the question: Islam - What does it mean for Muslims to follow God? We will be identifying:

- The core beliefs of Muslims.
- Why the five pillars are important to Muslims.
- · Challenges for Muslims in Britain today.
- How Muslims live in the North East compared to the United Arab Emirates.
- · How Mosques reflect Muslim beliefs.

Maths

In Maths during this half-term, our objectives will focus on fractions, decimals and percentages as well as area and perimeter.

This will involve:

- Finding equivalent fractions and decimals tenths & then hundredths.
- Order fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Percentage of an amount one step.
- Finding the perimeter of rectangles and squares.
- Working out the area of simple and compound shapes.

History

In History, we are finding out about **Maafa** and black history.

This will involve:

- Studying Africa's past.
- The development and end of the slave trade.
- Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade
- The causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa.

PSHE/RSE

This half term, we will be looking at how to recognise, predict, assess and manage risk in different situations. This will include:

- How to keep safe in the local environment and less familiar locations (e.g. near rail, water, road.
 Fire/firework safety; sun safety and the safe use of digital devices when out and about).
- How people can be influenced by their peers' behaviour and by a desire for peer approval.
- How to manage this influence; how people's online actions can impact on other people.
- How to keep safe online, including managing requests for personal information and recognising what is appropriate to share or not share online.

Science

In Science this half-term, we will be finding out about **Animals including Humans**

This will involve:

- Describing the changes as humans develop to old age.
- Identify and name parts of the human circulatory system and describe the functions of heart, blood and blood vessels.

Computing

In computing, we are going to explore web creation. This will involve:
