#### **Class News**

## Early Years

Eden class have been learning about the life cycles of plants and animals through stories such as the Hungry Caterpillar. We are observing our class caterpillars closely and making observations on the changes. We have continued to care for God's wonderful world by growing our own vegetables in the allotment. The children can now identify parts of a plant, seed, roots, shoot, leaves and flower. In maths the children have explored doubling, sharing and grouping. At home you could challenge your child to share food equally.

## Clyde Class

This week in English we have been writing a recount of Whiffy Wilson's first day at school. In maths we have been exploring direction and position. To support your child at home with directions ask them to describe how they can get around the garden or room using keyword such as left, right, forwards and backwards. We have enjoyed exploring cold habitats in Science and identifying which living things you will find there. In DT we have made beach huts where we used our plans and designs to create them.

#### Danube Class

This week we have been learning about time in maths. We have been identifying times on analogue and digital clocks. Through rhymes and songs we have been reciting how many days there are in each of the months, discussing how this changes in a leap year. In art we have continued with our ammonite project beginning the process of creating our print. We traced out our ammonite inspired design and transferred this to a polystyrene tile, ready to use to print. In English we have began to compose and write some persuasive letters. As always we thank you for your support with reading, spelling and times tables at home. In June will be the Year 4 multiplication check so please could this be a focus at home.

#### Mississippi Class

Mississippi class have written some fab persuasive texts in English this week, trying to persuade the reader to join Beowulf in his fight against the monsters. They used their knowledge from our class text to help them write an engaging piece of work. In maths, year 5 have been adding and subtracting decimals and year 6 have been revisiting fractions, decimals and percentages. We have enjoyed playing handball in P.E and taking part in outdoor adventurous activities - last week we took part in orienteering in the Nature Garden. Finally, in D.T we have been working with Mrs Hosking to design and make our own soup recipe. Year 6 have worked incredibly hard recently to practise for their SATs; please make sure they have a relaxing weekend this weekend before we begin SATs week next week!
